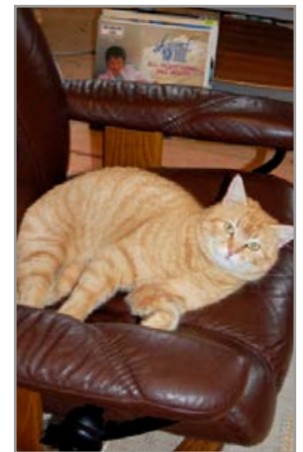
fine performances and fine recordings."

The setting is rather special since Dietmar was born at the farm, as was his father and his eldest son, Siegmund (21), who has now joined the hifi-Bauernhof operation.

good beer and good food. What more does one need?" adds Alan.

STANDS AND DELIVER

'GREEN' ECO-CREDIBLE STAND RANGE WELCOMED BY HARBETH

The High End in Munich (14-17 May) will see the official launch of ecologically-sound stands for each Harbeth loudspeaker. Hand-made in southern Bavaria, they are 'green' to the core and the result of loving care and personal attention to detail.

Sustainably-sourced beech timber from German forests is painstakingly transformed into hand-made stands during a labour-intensive process in Füssen. Everything about the products is natural: the power used is from hydro, glues are water-based and solvent-free, the coating from oil and wax. Even the company's bank is selected because of its ecological credentials.

Traditional carpentry skills ensure rigidity; not glues, metals or plastics. Even the (eco-plastic and vegetable starch)

packaging is sustainable and the transport used is gas-powered.

The duo of Eva-Maria Weichmann and Ralf Sieg give a percentage of their profits to good causes including Rainforest Rescue and German conservation projects.

"Having met Eva and Ralf, and learned about the skill and dedication they use to produce beautiful eco-stands, they are to be commended", said Harbeth's MD Alan Shaw. "Theirs is a genuine labour of love and with true regard for the environment."

HARBETH MONITOR LOUDSPEAKERS AT HEART OF NEW TV QUIZ SHOW

1000 Heartbeats is the new ITV daytime quiz show presented by Vernon Kay, that uniquely features a live string quartet in the studio.

Pictured (right) is the sound supervisor Tudor Davies with Sarah and Llinos from the quartet. Tudor states that using Harbeth studio monitor loudspeakers was an important decision for this unusual project. "When you are mixing a live string quartet you need to be very sure you are hearing the middle frequencies correctly, as this is where most problems are heard when closely miking string instruments. I knew that with the Harbeth reference monitors I was hearing something accurate, so could adjust the EQ accordingly."

The show (on ITV at 4pm weekdays) has a live string quartet playing at the tempo of the contestant's heart rate.
